

Parkinson's Foundation: Impact by State



In Kansas, there are an estimated **7,000 people with Parkinson's disease (PD)** who are 45 or older. The Parkinson's Foundation has invested **\$448,900** in **research** to better understand Parkinson's and to ensure **better care** for the Kansas PD community. As of 2019, in the last 5 years:

- **2,750 people with PD** accessed expert care annually at our **Center of Excellence**, University of Kansas Medical Center, with **285** enrolled in the Parkinson's Outcomes Project, the largest clinical study of PD.
- **290 health professionals** were trained to provide better care, and help close the gap in PD professional training.

We are equally committed to **educating and empowering** the Parkinson's community in Kansas. In the last 5 years:

- **1,720 Aware in Care kits** prepared people for planned and emergency hospital visits.
- **1,180 community members** affected by Parkinson's participated in local in-person and online educational programs.

Offered professional help through **900** calls to information specialists via our Helpline, with **140** referrals to expert care.



Helped people with Parkinson's live well, distributing **42,450** free publications.



Brought **5,650** Kansans together, raising **\$892,500** through Moving Day, A Walk for Parkinson's.
