In the last five years, the Parkinson's Foundation has invested **\$1,873,500** in research, better care, and education + empowerment for the **Georgia Parkinson's disease (PD) community**.



Improving Care

- Trained **520 health professionals**
- Offered help through **1,715 calls** to our Helpline
- Distributed **52,340 free publications** in English and Spanish
- Funded **two Centers of Excellence**
(Medical College of Georgia, Augusta University | Emory University)

Treated 2,660 people at our Centers of Excellence

95 people enrolled in the Parkinson's Outcomes Project, the largest clinical study of PD



Research

- **12 researchers** received grants totaling **\$663,100**
- **50 research advocates** paired with scientists to make research more effective



Education and Empowerment

- **1,980 Aware in Care kits** prepared people for the hospital
- **1,350 people** participated in educational programs
- **11,600 people** received free services through 19 community grants totaling **\$258,700**
- **2,500 people** walked for Parkinson's and raised **\$919,900** through Moving Day
