In the last five years, the Parkinson's Foundation has invested **\$1,458,300** in research, better care, and education + empowerment for the **Massachusetts Parkinson's disease (PD) community**.



## Improving Care

- Trained **1,150 health professionals**
- Offered help through **1,595 calls** to our Helpline
- Distributed **13,345 free publications** in English and Spanish
- Funded **two Centers of Excellence** .....

**Treated 3,170 people at our Centers of Excellence**

**205 people enrolled in the Parkinson's Outcomes Project, the largest clinical study of PD**



## Research

- **8 researchers** received grants totaling **\$381,000**
- **25 research advocates** paired with scientists to make research more effective



## Education and Empowerment

- **815 Aware in Care kits** prepared people for the hospital
- **1,290 people** received free services through 17 community grants totaling **\$193,500**
- **2,810 people** walked for Parkinson's and raised **\$773,800** through Moving Day

**17,040** people with PD in Massachusetts

which equals **\$852 million** in expenses for all those affected by PD in MA
