In the last five years, the Parkinson's Foundation has invested **\$988,200** in research, better care, and education + empowerment for the **Michigan Parkinson's disease (PD) community**.



Improving Care

- Trained **1,080 health professionals**
- Offered help through **1,875 calls** to our Helpline
- Distributed **13,500 free publications** in English and Spanish

Treated **193,500 people nationally** at our Centers of Excellence

13,000 people enrolled nationally in the **Parkinson's Outcomes Project**, the largest clinical study of PD



Research

- **7 researchers and 1 research center** (University of Michigan in collaboration with the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center) **received grants totaling \$970,400**
- **25 research advocates** paired with scientists to make research more effective



Education and Empowerment

- **1,020 Aware in Care kits** prepared people for the hospital
- **65 people** received free services through 1 community grants totaling **\$17,800**

which equals **\$1.2 billion** in expenses for all those affected by PD in MI
