In the last five years, the Parkinson's Foundation has invested **\$1,108,300** in research, better care, and education + empowerment for the **Pennsylvania Parkinson's disease (PD) community**.

IMPROVING CARE

- Trained **1,365** health professionals
- Offered help through **2,970** calls to our Helpline
- Distributed **34,940** free publications in English and Spanish
- Funded **two Centers of Excellence**
(Jefferson Health Comprehensive Parkinson's & Movement Disorder Center | University of Pennsylvania Movement Disorder Center)

Treated **3,480** people at our Centers of Excellence

235 people enrolled in the Parkinson's Outcomes Project, the largest clinical study of PD



RESEARCH

- **11** researchers received grants totaling **\$568,300**
- **30** research advocates paired with scientists to make research more effective



EDUCATION AND EMPOWERMENT

- **1,860** Aware in Care kits prepared people for the hospital
- **125** people received free services through 3 community grants totaling **\$45,700**
- **415** people walked for Parkinson's and raised **\$75,100** through Moving Day

35,410 people with PD in Pennsylvania

which equals **\$1.7 billion** in expenses for all those affected by PD in PA
