- Trained **270** health professionals
- Offered help through **770** calls to our Helpline
- Distributed **7,730** free publications in English and Spanish

Treated **193,500** people nationally at our Centers of Excellence

**15** people enrolled in WI in the Parkinson's Outcomes Project, the largest clinical study of PD

## RESEARCH



- **5** researchers received grants totaling **\$126,000**
- **5** research advocates paired with scientists to make research more effective

## EDUCATION AND EMPOWERMENT



- **590** Aware in Care kits prepared people for the hospital
- **270** people participated in educational programs
- **145** people received free services through 3 community grants totaling **\$33,700**
- **890** people walked for Parkinson's and raised **\$175,100** through Moving Day
