In the last five years, the Parkinson's Foundation has invested **\$118,500** in research, better care, and education + empowerment for the **New Jersey Parkinson's disease (PD) community**.



IMPROVING CARE

- Trained **1,030 health professional**
- Offered help through **2,710 calls** to our Helpline
- Distributed **14,860 free publications** in English and Spanish

Treated **193,500 people nationally** at our Centers of Excellence

115 people enrolled in NJ in the Parkinson's Outcomes Project, the largest clinical study of PD



RESEARCH

- **3 researchers** received grants totaling **\$59,000**
- **25 research advocates** paired with scientists to make research more effective

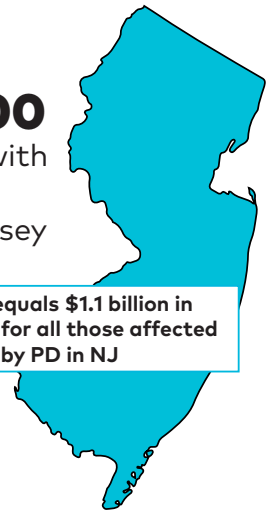


EDUCATION AND EMPOWERMENT

- **930 Aware in Care kits** prepared people for the hospital
- **540 people** participated in educational programs
- **535 people** received free services through 5 community grants totaling **\$59,500**
- **1,020 people** walked for Parkinson's and raised **\$238,700** through Moving Day
