Parkinson's Foundation: Impact by State



In Arizona, there are an estimated 18,000 people with Parkinson's disease (PD) who are 45 or older. The Parkinson's Foundation has invested \$491,900 in research to better understand Parkinson's and to ensure better care for the Arizona PD community. As of 2018, in the last 5 years:

- 2,160 people with PD accessed expert care annually at our Center of Excellence,
 Barrow Neurological Institute, with 264 enrolled in the Parkinson's Outcomes Project, the largest clinical study of PD.
- 2 researchers received research grants for their work to better understand Parkinson's.
- 170 health professionals were trained to provide better care, and help close the gap in PD professional training.

We are equally committed to **educating and empowering** the PD community in Arizona. In the last 5 years:

- 1,670 Aware in Care kits prepared people for planned and emergency hospital visits.
- 4 research advocates people with PD and care partners were paired with scientists to make research more effective and efficient.
