

Parkinson's Foundation: Impact by State



In Pennsylvania, there are an estimated **35,100 people with Parkinson's disease (PD)** who are 45 or older. The Parkinson's Foundation has invested **\$1,019,000** in **research** to better understand Parkinson's and to ensure **better care** for the Pennsylvania PD community. As of 2018, in the last 5 years:

- **1,680 people with PD** accessed expert care annually at our **Center of Excellence**, University of Pennsylvania Movement Disorder Center, with **450** enrolled in the *Parkinson's Outcomes Project*, the largest clinical study of PD.
- **13 researchers** received research grants for their work to better understand Parkinson's.
- **650 health professionals** were trained to provide better care, and help close the gap in PD professional training.

We are equally committed to **educating and empowering** the PD community in Pennsylvania. In the last 5 years:

- **2,665 Aware in Care kits** prepared people for planned and emergency hospital visits.
- **9 research advocates** — people with PD and care partners — were paired with scientists to make research more effective and efficient.

Offered professional help through **2,990** calls to information specialists via our Helpline, with **650** referrals to expert care.



Helped people with Parkinson's live well, distributing **30,340** free publications.



Brought Pennsylvanians together to raise awareness for Parkinson's.
